What's Been Accomplished This Year!

A major component of our Strategic Plan was completed in 2018. The Drexel H. Foundation worked with Engineers, Architects and Economic development experts towards our mission to restore the Vale Hotel for

a vibrant Main Street building. A Master Plan document was created. Public input was magnificent. Paper and online surveys, and public meetings were held to engage & solicit opinions on what uses in the building people thought "would be economically viable and supported by the community". Numerous on site tours to interested volunteers, business people and artists solicited a variety of opinions as to locations as feasible redevelopment spaces. This input zeroed in on the specific uses for the building that matched our communities' vision which had been previously shared with our foundation over the last 20 years and unearthed new uses. The Economic report studied basic requirements for the anticipated uses, market potential, community impact, and rated the supply and demand within our town and region. Based upon this study our architect and engineer began code analysis of each space within the building in light of its anticipated economically feasible use. The final Master Plan document contains our phased plan and next steps to enable our organization to create a capital campaign, attract tenants, and seek funding for preservation of the Vale Hotel.

Oregon Humanities statewide Conversation Project

The Drexel Foundation partnered with Oregon Humanities statewide Conversation Project to bring two individuals to the community to discuss Creating Inclusive Communities, and Everyday Leaders. Rachel Bernstein joined the community on April 23rd and went over the wide variety of ways to create an environment that gets everyone involved in community events and projects. On April 30th Lois Ruskai Melina joined us for another great conversation. This time it was about everyday leaders. How to become one, what to look for in leaders, etc. Both of these conversations were open to the public and highly encouraged the high school students to attend. They are our future. Many joined us who are becoming more involved in the community and becoming leaders. Both conversation nights we had great community involvement and everyone went home with lots of information. We can't thank the Oregon Humanities enough for helping us bring these individuals to our community to help improve it.

Art in the Park On Flag Day

The Drexel Foundation kicked off the first of its Free summer art programs with Art in the Park on Flag Day. 35 kids and 15 adults joined Drexel H. Foundations president Sandijean Fuson and other volunteers to give Wadleighs playground equipment a new coat of paint. For the past 18 years, the Drexel Foundation has been giving the park playground equipment a brand new coat of paint, and the participants participated in a mini- mural painting competition. This year there were 4 age categories and each 1st place winner took home a trophy and prizes. The first place trophy winners: for the ages 4-7 was Clair Bymers, 8-12 age group

Amilia Iracheta, 13-16 age group was Halley Zieigele and 17+ age category was Gigi Koeger. The largest trophy went to Ariel Shaw who won the overall grand prize of BEST OF SHOW. The participants were very creative. All enjoyed their community service, games, food, and the event's awards & prizes.



Art Beat on Main Street

To tie art & restoration together a fundraising event called "Art Beat on Main Street" was held in June! This year the Drexel Foundation partnered with Spring into Wellness. Tours of the Historical Vale Hotel and Grand Opera House were given to



raise money for the 2018 art season and restoration efforts. Health vendors were there to share their knowledge with the community. Some of the vendors gave away gifts, even a bike was given to one lucky individual. The golden sponsor Malheur Federal Credit Union provided the stage which was open for some of Vales local talent. Preforming was Rayanna Hansen, Darin Smith, Joe Fuson, & Greg Michell and Jim Stewart. The Opera House patio was a perfect venue for this free outdoor concert and Drexel's public art show.

Vale Elementary K-6th and Harper School K-12 students received prizes and a Certificate of Achievement for their participation in the arts, scholastic ability, and citizenship from the Drexel H. Foundation, as part of our youth and family culture & art programs. Each Teacher chose three recipients for the "Certificate of Achievement Award," which included a prize of popcorn, soda, and candy at a special free show at the Rex Theater. The special movie day presented many short films from Drexel's Film Festival movies. Two students from each school were award a backpack full of new art & school supplies. The foundation is proud to work hand in hand with our local schools, to provide these awards to students.

The Annual Art Camp was kicked off on August 6th at 9:00 am. Art Camp was held at the Rex Theater Monday- Wednesday, with about 30-50 participants each day. This was our 22nd year holding this fun filled FREE event. On Monday the participants learned about Children's Theater, created puppets, sidewalk chalk, and created mini- movies using green screen technology. Tuesday was filled with making Christmas ornaments for the Vale Chamber Tree lighting, Collage & mosaic art and an all time favorite every year making musical instruments. On Wednesday

VHS dancers Kayla Flint and TeiLee Hill came and taught the children a dance that they performed later in the week at the Talent Show. This was followed by jewelry making, and watching the mini puppet movies filmed earlier in the week. All the kids got to see their stories on the big screen. Talent Show

Following Art Camp we celebrated the 22nd year of holding the **Talent Show** on the stage at Vale's beautifully restored 1914 Rex Theater. The show was a huge success, and approx. 100 people enjoyed this great FREE family fun event . There were 24 individual contestants, some performing more than once with others in groups or other age categories. The first place winner in each age category went home with over a \$50 value in gift certificates, each with \$100.00 cash, a huge

trophy and lots of cool prizes. The Second & Third place winners also received trophies & gift certificates. Everyone who performed received a big sack of prizes.



Crash Course in Filmmaking

On September 5th Drexel Foundation held the 12th annual Crash Course in Filmmaking, this year professional film maker Phill Stucker returned to help participants create a film in just 3 short hours. There were about 25 participants ranged in ages from 7-59. All participants got to

choose how they were going to be a part of the movie, acting, sound technicians, lighting, grips, production assistants, cameramen, costume and technical crew. The new movie "Para-annoyed", is a spoof about the ghost hunter culture and the
