Our second event of the year was The Yard Art Competition. The theme was "kindness" and there were fantastic interpretations of what this means. All the en-




tries were great! We had a tie for 1st place youth went to Ruby

Because of the DEQ Workforce Development Repair and Reuse grant we have been able to hire staff to refurbish bikes to give away FREE. Approx-

imately 50 bikes through drawings held at various Drexel events for the last 2years were given away FREE . Thank you to DEQ, Laurie Gordon, and their staff. We will continue to have sustainability embedded in our programing and a staff member dedicated to sustainability efforts at the Drexel H Foundation to continue to refurbish bikes headed to the dump.




Grand Opera House Restoration & Celebrating our Heritage Event

Thanks to an Oregon Cultural Trust grant we achieved a 25+ goal to get exterior access stairs for fire/safety from the 2nd floor to ground level so preservation work can continue towards the Grand Opera House occupancy. These stairs are in the same location, built of the same materials, and in the same configuration as the original stairs. We also accomplished installation of for our electrical upgrade and installed



the large 2 phase electrical power box

sewer piping for a "clean out" vent. Since there is much more to be done, a capital campaign will be our focus in 2024-25 to finish the plumbing for ADA bath-



In November we celebrated this progress and had a free Celebrate our Heritage Event. We had food, music, painted sheep as part of our art builds community project, had live music from Gina Rojas, and cut the ribbon for our new stairs. We honored our participants, volunteers, sponsors, contributors and staff and had a drawing for 5 more FREE bikes.



One Year Rest Repair & Recharge EV Station Update

Drexel H. Foundation's Electric Vehicle Charging Station and local amenities have proven a success and are bringing people to town. Locals and tourist are enjoying a free bike repair station with tools and pump, and Level 2 electric vehicle charging station, with dual ports serving all types of electric vehicles. At the crossroads of Hwy 20 & 26 the EV charger has been busy since Nov 2022



when it launched, with over 346 charging sessions, for 52 unique drivers, saving 1,418 kg of greenhouse gases & pollution from the air we breathe. All this for FREE to all kinds of Electric Vehicle visitors. Through bottledrop funds and donations, we provided over 6,631 miles, saving 159 gallons of gas. Also 200 maps have been distributed showing everyone is also enjoying the exterior display boards celebrating untold stories of Basque families contributions to the community, taking the bike-walking tour, looking at the online historical photos for 10 of Vale's historic downtown buildings QR codes, and visiting Vales Public art and the 28 Vale Murals, which are interpretations of historic events from our area.
